COVID-19 SYMTOMS during the Half-Term Holiday

If your child develops symptoms compatible with coronavirus (COVID-19) in the half-term holiday, they should STAY AT HOME. Please contact school via email at delveslaneprimary@durhamlearning.net The emails will be monitored at intervals throughout the holidays for Coronavirus ONLY.

Anyone with symptoms should stay at home for at least 10 days and book a test. This can be done by calling 119 or online through the NHS website: www.nhs.uk/coronavirus. The rest of the household needs to stay at home for 14 days to self-isolate. All children attending school will have access to a test if they display symptoms of COVID-19 and are encouraged to get tested.

The symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- the loss or change of their sense of taste or smell

Any pupil who develops any of the above symptoms should be tested. There is no need for their households to have a test, unless they are also symptomatic.

Children may feel unwell with a common cold, sore throat, headache or upset stomach. These are not

symptoms and therefore a test is not required and self-isolation is not required.

Once a test has been taken, if the test is negative, all isolation can end. Please inform us via email delveslaneprimary@durhamlearning.net and send confirmation of the negative test.

If the test is positive, the child must remain in isolation alongside their family and the latest government guidance will need to be followed. <u>Please also email us if your child tests positive during the half-term holiday</u>. Thank you.

Jewellery in School

For Health & Safety reasons we discourage the wearing of any form of jewellery in Nursery and School. This is supported by the Government through the Department for Education (DFE) and Local Authority regulations and guidance. We aim to keep all children safe from harm and ask you as parents to adhere to this by not allowing your child to come to school wearing jewellery. Due to the fact that in our Early Years Foundation Stage (Nursery and Reception) the curriculum is taught through some structured play and outdoor learning, it is STRONGLY ADVISED that children in these classes DO NOT wear jewellery at all in school. We accept that there may be occasions where jewellery cannot reasonably be removed e.g. earrings in the first six weeks after ears have been pierced. As it is inappropriate for your child to remain at home during such a period, jewellery will be tolerated in such instances (ears must be covered by a plaster/tape provided by you). Thank you for your support.

End of the Day

Several children from different bubbles are playing on the infant play equipment at the end of the day, whilst in the care of parents and carers. We strongly advise children to remain with their parent or carer and NOT access the play equipment for health and safety reasons.

PE Kits & Coats

During the colder month's children MUST wear a 'WINTER' PE kit. This is outlined below:

- Plain navy-blue hoody
- Plain navy-blue/black jogging bottoms
- Girls can also wear navy-blue or black leggings in the colder months.
- Black plimsolls or appropriate sports footwear
