Dear Parents & Carers,

## Parent & Carer Conversations

Next week your child's class teacher will be contacting you via telephone to let you know how your child has settled into their new class and year group. Teachers will also update you on your child's general well-being. Phone calls will be made to parents from 3.45pm onwards starting on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> October. All phone calls will be made across the week up to and including Friday 16<sup>th</sup> October. If you are not able to take the call, teachers will try and get in touch on an alternative day next week. Please understand that the call may come from a withheld number, If you are unable to receive a call next week, please email the school office and we will organise an alternative time and date for you to have contact with your child's class teacher. Thank you.

## Parent & Carer Emails

We send out information to parents and carers on a daily basis. Please can you check your email accounts every day as we don't want you to miss important messages. ## Water Bottles

Every child should bring their own, named, bottle of water to be kept in the classroom. Children will use this throughout the day including at LUNCHTIMES. At the end of each day, water bottles must be taken home and cleaned with an anti-bacterial solution. Thank you.

## Google Classroom

Children from Classes 3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13 & 14 are all able to login to Google Classrooms. Google Classroom is an exciting, learning platform with curriculum resources we have developed for your child to access. Your child will have access to Google Classroom using a school email address and a password which has previously been sent to you via text message and email. Google Classroom has been designed to support pupils having access to increased online learning and crucially develop stronger communication directly with teachers. It will allow pupils and staff to collaborate on one learning platform. Your child will be able to access homework that has been assigned by their teacher. Children will also be provided with remote educational resources (home learning resources) in the event of a child or group of children having to self-isolate.

All teachers now have a dedicated google e-mail address for contact with families. These @delveslane.school e-mail addresses are exclusively for contact concerning your child's education. Please contact the main school

This digital platform gives parents and carers the opportunity to share their child's learning, communicate with their class teachers and receive regular updates, reminders, notifications and important information all in one place.

During the coming week, parents/carers will receive an email notification to the email address you registered with school which will contain an activation link so you can create your own password. Keep an eye out in your junk folder in case it arrives there!

Tapestry is available through a browser and an app which is accessible on Android and Apple devices. <u>Currently,</u> the app is ONLY able to show observations of children so don't forget to check on the browser for all the amazing things that will be shared with you, including any important memos!

More detailed information on how to use the online platform will be shared in the coming weeks, as well as a user guide! Please can we have an up to date email address for parents & carers of children in our Early Years classes. Thank you.

## REMINDER CORONAVIRUS

Durham County Council are reminding all residents to:

- 1) Wash hands for 20 seconds and often
- 2) Cover face whenever possible
- 3) Make **space** stay 2 metres apart from others
- 4) Get a **test** if you have symptoms of Coronavirus

It's great to see our families following our new entrance, one-way system and exit from the school. Here is a reminder of the procedures we must all follow.

- Please can we all continue to socially distance from other families. <u>Where parents cannot socially</u> <u>distance, then we strongly recommend parents & carers wear a face covering</u>.
- > Children CANNOT cycle or scoot on school grounds
- > Children MUST WALK when on school grounds
- We strongly recommend parents and carers wear a face covering when entering and exiting school. This is recommended because some areas can become quite congested.
- DLPS has been advised that only ONE parent or carer should drop off and collect their child/children each day. Thank you.

#### **REMINDER COVID-19 SYMTOMS**

If your child develops symptoms compatible with coronavirus (COVID-19), they should STAY AT HOME. Please contact school at once and notify us. However, if your child develops symptoms at school, they will be sent home. Anyone with symptoms should stay at home for at least 10 days and book a test. This can be done by calling 119 or online through the NHS website: www.nhs.uk/coronavirus. The rest of the household needs to stay at home for 14 days to self-isolate. All children attending school will have access to a test if they display symptoms of COVID-19 and are encouraged to get tested.

The symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- the loss or change of their sense of taste or smell

Any pupil who develops any of the above symptoms should be tested. There is no need for their households to have a test, unless they are also symptomatic.

Children may feel unwell with a common cold, sore throat, headache or upset stomach. These are not symptoms and therefore a test is not required and self-isolation is not required.

Once the test has been taken, if the test is negative, all isolation ends and the child and the household can return to school and work. Please inform us and send confirmation of the negative test.

If the test is positive, the child remains in isolation alongside their family and the latest government guidance will need to be followed. The social group for that child or staff member will be contacted and we will engage with Public Health England and Test and Trace.

#### Attendance & Punctuality

Please can we remind parents and carers to contact school by telephone or email on EVERY DAY that your child is absent from school. We also need to ensure that children arrive on time for school every day. Please can we ask parents and carers to make non-urgent appointments, e.g. opticians, etc. for your child after school. Thank you.

#### Parent Survey – Remote Education

Thank you for your responses, we had 96 in total. This gives school a good indication of how families have managed remote education over the lockdown period and how school can plan should further restrictions be put into place.

We will only provide remote education (home learning) in the following circumstances:

1. A child has to isolate for 14 days because they have been in 'close contact' with someone who has tested positive at school. School will contact Public Health and communicate immediately with those families affected.

- 2. A child has to isolate for 14 days because someone in their household or support bubble has tested positive
- 3. A child has tested positive and needs to isolate for at least 10 days from the day their test was taken

Children can be dropped off between 7.50am and 8.00am ONLY for Breakfast Club. <u>When collecting your child from Childcare, you will not be able to access the entrance area if</u> **you are not wearing a face covering**.
