Dear Parent/Carer

We are coming to the end of our second week back at school following the Easter holidays. Our school family have been back together for a total of five weeks since schools reopened for all children. We do appreciate that due to the pandemic, some children will take longer to settle than others and everyone's experience of the pandemic will be different. Alongside our core subjects of Reading, Writing and Maths, we are very much continuing to focus on developing children's friendships and social skills (personal, social and emotional skills) as well as their physical development at school.

Reception 2021 New Starters

All of our Reception 2021 new starters for September should have had their places confirmed recently. We hope they have been successful in gaining a place in the school of their choice. For those children and families starting their school journey with us, we will be in touch before the half term holiday with further dates and information about meetings. Parking/Roadworks

It is imperative that when parents or carers drop off or pick up their children that they do so with due care and attention and do not put our children or others at risk. Families should also consider our local community and park safely and in appropriate areas. It may result in parents parking a small distance away from school and walking into the school grounds to drop off or collect their children. It is important to our school that positive relations with our local community remain in place and do not diminish due to inconsiderate, dangerous parking by parents, carers or visitors.

We do appreciate that the problem has become more problematic recently with the current gas works, but the safety of our children and others who come onto the site is paramount. Please consider walking your child to school if you live within walking distance, this is not only good for your health and wellbeing but will help to alleviate the traffic congestion outside of our school.

Healthy Snacks/Packed Lunches

Children's packed lunches should be based on the 'Eatwell Guide' model which shows items in the 5 main food groups; (Food Standards Agency).

Bread, Rice, Potatoes, Pasta

These starchy foods are a healthy source of energy. Packed lunches should include 2 or more portions.

Fruit and Vegetables

These foods provide vitamins, minerals and fibre. Lunches should include at least 1 portion of fruit and 1 portion of vegetables / salad, or more.

Milk and Dairy foods

These foods provide calcium for healthy bones and teeth. Include 1 portion at lunch.

Meat, Fish, Eggs, Beans

These foods provide protein for growth. Packed lunches should include 1 portion of these foods.

Foods and drinks high in fat and / or sugar

It is important not to fill up on too many foods that are high in fat and / or sugar at the expense of other more nutritious foods. Limiting high fat and sugar foods will help protect young people from becoming overweight as well as helping prevent tooth decay, heart disease, stroke, and diabetes. This is why sweets, chocolate, crisps, cereal bars, fruit bars, toffee/salted popcorn, squash and fizzy drinks are no longer available in schools. Please support your school by not including these items in a packed lunch.

Please make sure to follow the guidelines above, from the local authority when preparing a packed lunch for your child. Thank you.
